Founded in 1973, Woodstock Day School (WDS) is a progressive, independent school set on a 40-acre campus in New York's Hudson Valley. Located midway between the towns of Woodstock and Saugerties and roughly two hours north of Manhattan, WDS is a board-certified member of the New York State Association of Independent Schools and offers a unique and inclusive educational experience to approximately 200 students from nursery school through grade twelve.

WDS believes that there is no such thing as an "average" student, and our combination of purposefully small class sizes, intensely committed faculty and a culture of individual respect empowers our students to aim high, shape and achieve their personal goals, and prepares them to make a positive difference in a complex world. Added to the program in 2003, our middle and upper schools offer outstanding programs for grades 6-12, helping students discover their passions, achieve academic and personal excellence and demonstrate a commitment to service. WDS actively seeks to build a diverse community of educators.

Summary

The Physical Education Teacher is the primary instructional delivery person for student fitness, and coordination. From Nursery School through Upper School, every student

has physical education classes twice a week. The goals are to build self-efficacy, physical awareness, cooperation and sportsmanship, and good health and wellness. Students engage in activities for physical skill building (running, catching, throwing), cooperation and problem-solving (cooperative games and outdoor education) and also for particular sports (yoga, basketball, volleyball, soccer and others.) Our physical education and athletic program provides opportunities for students to discover what they are passionate about as athletes and to build individual athletic facilities in addition to building skills like cooperation, perseverance, and reflection.

Full-time employment includes a regular schedule as a Floating Teaching Assistant working in NS through Grade 12 classes as assigned.

Ideal candidates embrace a range of pedagogical approaches, are excited about teaching in a progressive community and have demonstrated a commitment to addressing issues of diversity, equity, and inclusion within and outside the classroom.

Additional expectations include attending staff meetings, providing support in other classrooms, common planning meetings, in-service days including a week at the end of August and a week after school ends in mid-June, and participating in the life of the school. Faculty hours on campus are 8:00 am to 3:45 pm, with weekly faculty meetings until 5 pm once a week.

Key Responsibilities

- Teach physical fitness classes according to the needs and curricular program of assigned grades.
- Facilitate students' physical, cognitive, and social and emotional learning through lessons designed to sequentially develop skills appropriate to their ability, confidence levels, and developmental stage.
- Teach knowledge and skills in physical fitness, and individual, or team sports utilizing curriculum and other appropriate learning activities.
- Provide maximum participation for all students; differentiate as needed to ensure all students experience success.
- Develop engaging and effective lesson plans and supplementary materials.
- Provide ongoing formative feedback to students.
- Communicate in developmentally appropriate ways through a humane, sensitive approach that clearly communicates that every student, regardless of ability, can succeed and will benefit from a physically active, healthy lifestyle.

- Evaluate fitness and social and emotional growth of students, prepares report cards, and keeps appropriate records as necessary. Communicate with parents and class teachers on student progress.
- Work cooperatively and collaboratively with other teachers to improve the instructional program and student success.
- As a full-time teaching role, responsibilities will also include serving as a regular floating substitute to provide coverage for classes from Nursery School through 12th Grade.
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications

- Bachelors' degree in education or a related field. Masters degree preferred.
- Previous experience teaching Physical Education at the Nursery School - Grade 6 level.
- NYS Teacher Certification in Physical Education (preferred but not required).
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Knowledge of many different kinds of exercise.
- Motivation and enthusiasm with a genuine passion for teaching young learners.
- Ability to create a student-centered classroom.
